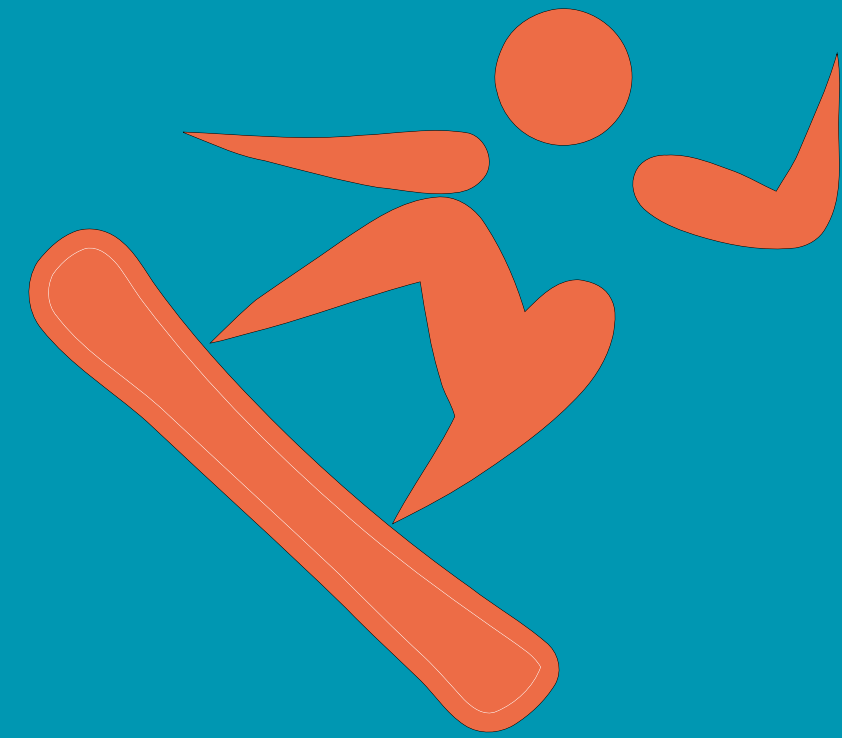
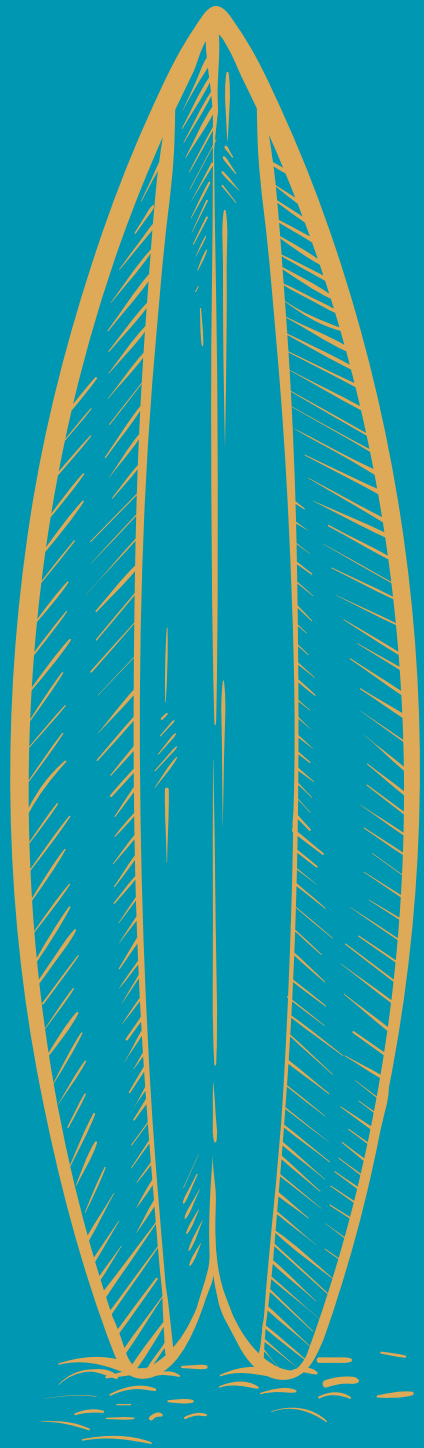

The initiative in Norway

On the organization:

- It's totally free but if you break something you pay**
- equipments for summer sports and winter sports (but can't have decades of shoes* for example because it's really expensive)**
 - get some money from the local and national government**
- leaded by Øystein Makaelsen helped by 2 or 10 students (on holiday or not)**
 - no coaches so it's not really for beginners**
 - buy and repare equipments**

- it's also important to have new equipment (to buy it)**
 - wanna reach more young people**

Link with the democracy
